NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS

Disposal Fee for Marginal Landfill Cover Materials, Such as Petroleum Contaminated Soil (PCS), Well Drilling Mud, Harbor/Lake Dredging Materials

(Effective January 1, 2009)

The District accepts petroleum contaminated soils, well drilling mud, harbor and lake dredgings, and other minimally contaminated soils for use as a marginal landfill cover. The disposal fee for these Marginal Cover Materials (MCM) is \$10.00 per ton, with a \$15.00 minimum charge. In addition to the \$10.00/ton disposal fee, there is a processing fee of \$100.00 per project site.

The following conditions apply:

- MCM is subject to prior approval for waste acceptance, including the submittal of a Generator Waste Profile.
- The District does not accept materials that are defined as hazardous under RCRA or CCR Title 22.
- Contact the District at 831-384-5313 for testing requirements and contaminant threshold limits.
- MCM must have a moisture content of less than 50% by weight.
- If the moisture content of the material is greater than 50% by weight, the material may be accepted at the liquid waste rate of \$47.00/ton.
- MCM must have less than 1% debris by volume.
- MCM containing debris of greater than 1% by volume may be accepted at the regular solid waste rate of \$47.00/ton.

NOTE: Clean soil is accepted at the rate of \$1.00/ton if it contains less than 1% debris by volume (such as large size rocks, large size tree roots, construction/demolition debris, etc), has a moisture content of less than 20% by weight, and has no chemical contamination (such as lead, petroleum products, and pesticides).
